The dry dock service will prepare all aspects of her technical and mechanical capability as well as her interiors and extraordinary guest spaces so that they are in the finest condition ready for November.

"The attention to detail shown by Damen will ensure that the ship's return will enhance this already momentous occasion for our crew and guests."
